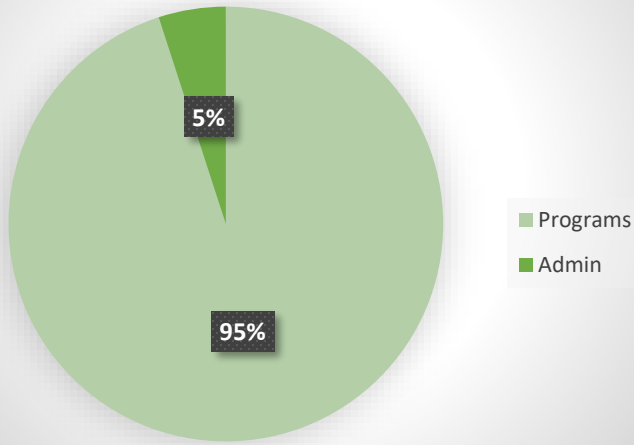
As a St. Mary's Food Bank Partner, we are one of the largest food pantries in Arizona, serving more than 25,000 families annually.



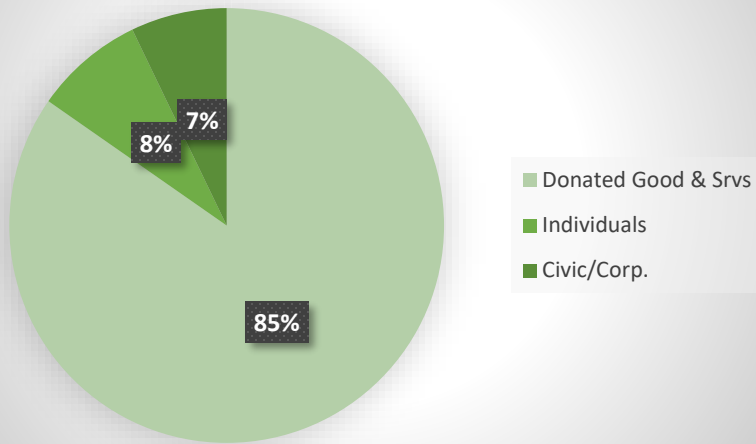
- Annual Volunteers: 817
